

Spartanburg Christian Academy Tuition Assistance

Spartanburg Christian Academy desires for all students to have access to Kingdom Education through enrollment at SCA. In an effort to financially assist families who long for an excellent education with a biblical worldview, Spartanburg Christian Academy has instituted a tuition assistance fund.

Tuition Assistance Guidelines:

- Tuition assistance is given on a needs basis.
- No student is given tuition assistance for academic or athletic ability.
- Average award for tuition assistance is typically 30% or less of the tuition. All remaining tuition along with other fees will be the responsibility of the enrolled family.
- Parents must re-apply for tuition assistance each year. Receipt of funds during one school year does not guarantee receipt of funds in following years or that the same amount of funds will be awarded in following years.
- Submission of tuition assistance paperwork is not a binding agreement implying that funds will be granted.
- 3K and 4K students are not eligible for tuition assistance.
- Tuition assistance may be granted to current SCA families upon instances of hardship (death of parent/guardian, job loss, etc.).

Additionally, the following factors will be considered when awarding tuition assistance:

- Academic merit and behavioral standing of the student
- Enrollment goals per grade level
- Payment history
- Parents' commitment to Kingdom Education

Tuition Assistance Application Process:

Application

- Submission
 - Parents apply by completing a tuition assistance form from a third party, CTAS (available on the SCA website under the admissions tab). In order for a tuition assistance form to be processed, CTAS requires the following to be submitted:
 - Tuition assistance form
 - Complete tax return from the prior year
 - Copies of each parent's W2 forms
- Deadlines for Turning in Tuition Assistance Forms
 - Re-enrolling Students: April 30
 - New Students: August 31

Awarding of Assistance

- Once CTAS processes the applications, SCA is notified of the qualifying assistance recommendations.
- Once SCA has reviewed the recommendations, assistance is awarded based on need, availability of funds, academic merit and behavioral standing of the student, enrollment goals per grade level, payment history, and the parents' commitment to Kingdom Education.

Tuition assistance is approved (*anonymously*) by the SCA School Board and is calculated without regard to race, handicap, color or national origin.
